Due to the unprecedented times from March 2020 to the present. School Improvement goals and work had to continue in *Distance Learning* and *Hybrid* delivery models. If you were able to meet any of the goals set from last year, please explain:

Our goals for the 2019-2020 school year were as follows:

- **Literacy-** Lincoln Academy students will meet standard at the same percentage as their cohort group in the Stanwood-Camano School District on the English Language Arts (ELA) Smarter Balanced Assessment.
- **Math-** Lincoln Academy students will meet standard at the same percentage as their cohort group in the Stanwood-Camano School District on the Mathematics Smarter Balanced Assessment.
- **Attendance -** All Lincoln Academy students will attend school at least 90% of the days they are enrolled in Lincoln Academy.
- **Parent Involvement** 100% of parents / guardians will attend student conferences in the fall and spring.

Progress toward these goals were difficult to measure. For the literacy and math goals, there was no measurable data available because Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) testing was not implemented in the spring.

Attendance was measured but did not amuseme the same limiting factors from when the goal was made. Some of these limiting factors included the incentives and connections that staff developed in an on-site model.

Parent involvement through conferences was not able to be measured in the spring because conferences were canceled.

Current School Data:

Lincoln Academy's current school data includes two data points: enrollment and grades.

Enrollment: Lincoln Academy is at full enrollment capacity (20 students) for the first time in the last 10 years. This is positive data but speaks to the struggles students and families have had this year as they look for alternate placement.

Grades:

This grade representation for semester 1 of the 2020-2021 school year is consistent with other grade levels and schools. One note is that the students who choose to come to Lincoln Academy are often disengaged with school and/or struggling with their studies. The fact that these grade percentages are consistent with other schools (although lower than desired), is encouraging.

What does your data review indicate about learning loss by students during the pandemic and necessary action steps to transition back to in-person learning?

A piece of background knowledge that is crucial is that between 8 and 9 students have been coming to campus four days per week to work with paraeducators on their learning. The data review reveals clearly that those students that have been coming to campus in an in-person model have higher achievement than those that do not.

What are your interim goals and plans based on data?

Goals:

The structure of the classes will be designed so that all students will increase their engagement and academic skills in core content classes as measured by passing rate during the 2020-21 school year.
